

Why we forgot how to grow food


As a food shortage looms, people are digging for Britain — and their dinner table. John-Paul Flintoff gets back to our roots




40% of all Food is Imported

Debbie, 47, enlisted a group of her friends to share the chores of growing fruit and vegetables to help make Macclesfield a more environmentally friendly place.

The mum-of-two said: "Oil is used to process food, package it and distribute it, so as the price of oil rises, food will too.

"Growing your own food is more environmentally friendly and much more economical. We're learning everything as we go along, it's a really positive thing to be involved in."

She added: "It's cultivate the produce or starting their own community groups.


Debbie added. "It's al about sharing. Someone may be very eager to grow veg but not have the land, and there may be someone elderly with the space but can't cope with an allotment."






